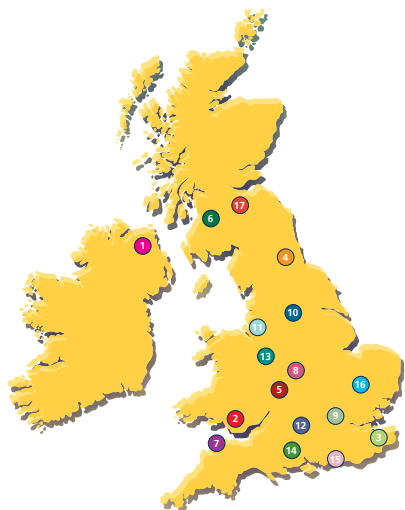

How much does it cost?

When you rehome a dog, we ask for a small adoption fee - any additional donation will also be gratefully received. Each dog goes home with a brand new collar and lead.

Rehoming a dog.

- 🐾 Before you rehome a dog please remember that food, veterinary bills, and pet insurance can be expensive
- 🐾 You should also consider how you'll exercise your dog and the amount of time you can spend with him
- 🐾 Here's how to go about rehoming a dog from Dogs Trust:

- 1) Come along to the centre and fill in a rehoming questionnaire at reception. Our highly-trained staff will be able to help you find the right dog for the way you live
- 2) Have a walk round and once you've made your choice, go back to reception to 'reserve' the dog you want. All family members – including other dogs – should be present to meet your new four-legged friend.
- 3) Before you adopt, we'll visit your home to make sure your dog is the best choice for your lifestyle. You may also be asked to attend a pre-adoption talk.

- 🐾 If you don't find the dog for you on your first visit, please come again because new dogs arrive everyday!
